



FROM HATE TO CORRECT-HUMAN-RELATIONS

To change a way of life and build a new civilisation, a profound change in our way of thinking is required. The savage terrorist attack of Tuesday September 11, in New York City and Washington DC offers us this opportunity. However to be able to seize this opportunity we need to understand the reasons which provoked it, extracting from the tragedy and from the negative aspects a positive and constructive view.

The first lesson which emerges for all is that of respect for the LAWS. There exist Universal Laws which humans must learn to recognize and respect. Two of these Laws are the Law of "Cause-and-Effect", and that which affirms "energy follows thought".

That which humans think and speak does not go lost in space but creates a thought-form, an electric field which attracts by assonance until it forms an actual mental and emotional disturbance which will, sooner or later, manifest itself physically.

It is our opinion that the principal general cause for that which has happened in the United States is the hate which has been introduced into space for years, decades and centuries through political ideologies, religious conflicts, images and models proposed by the media (films), cultural ignorance which has stimulated competition and confrontation between individuals, groups and nations.

That which the USA and the Western nations should learn from this lesson is that there has been a misuse of authority and power. There has been an imposition of their own proper role without allowing consent. Authority is never defined by itself, but rather by the recognition that others are willing to attribute to it. Otherwise it creates reaction, ideological opposition and fanatical delay of the opportune moment to destroy it. Since a long time the West has spoken of Peace. That which it has not understood, however, is that Peace is an **effect** and not a **cause**. Peace is the result of the implementation of justice and correct relationships between individuals, groups and nations.

Many have said that after the attacks in New York and Washington the world will never be the same. We hope and wish that it will be so. Today the West has a great opportunity to transform its current way-of-life by radically modifying its actual concept of authority and power. It should demonstrate to the rest of the world that its authority and its power are not based on its physical, economical and military strength but rather on its evolutionary conscience, on its ethical and moral determination to apply justice and to eliminate famine, poverty and ignorance.

Only in this way can it dispel hate and eradicate terrorism and only if it is able to make a profound self-criticism on its life style, egoistic and materialistic, which it has created; a modus vivendi fundamentally based on the accumulation of wealth and material well-being (consumerism), subordinating and withering human relations which are the cornerstone of life, the final goal of human existence. In this sense the USA has proposed to the world a model and a culture which have produced responsibility and attracted ideologic reactions which have contributed to produce the tragic events mentioned.

We are, everyone, today called upon to reflect deeply. The mass-media, culture and show business - in virtue of the above mentioned Laws - must understand that words, images and sounds which are sent into space may have disastrous consequences. A catastrophic film or a novel which expresses hate will open doors which permit what has been described to actually happen in reality.

Terrorism is born from the childlike conviction that one can have whatever he wants by instilling fear in the others: "Give me the jam otherwise I'll break the jar!". That which we are asked today is to be aware that world-wide terrorism is not an extraneous thing, on the contrary it applies to each one of us personally because, without realising it, we can adhere to the terrorism which feeds the electrical field (made of manners and thoughts analogous to billions of other persons) which will give vent to action in some area of the world.

The threat to use individual physical violence to arrive to a goal, or of violent street manifestations to put forward one's own ideas and any form of psychological pressure activated to force others to accept our ideas, are really and truly acts of terrorism.

Today we are called upon to comprehend that each one of us, individually, has a responsibility in that which has happened in the United States, even though this was not our will or our intentions. We were very far from wishing it. We are asked to understand that any irascibility, irritation, antipathy, irony, criticism, sarcasm, cynicism, anger, religious or class conflict, rivalry in sports, economics or politics, and contempt are by-products which feed and strengthen the electrical field of hate, from which terrorism is born. Not even a "toothpick" can be cast against another person!

These facts have much clarified the choices of ideals, existential and ethical of mankind, who now is obliged to take sides openly and clearly with democracy or totalitarianism, with dialogue or with violence, with freedom or with coercion, with civilised culture or with barbarism, with acceptance of differences or with the "Holy War", with evolution or with involution, with Light or Darkness, with the Good or with the Bad, anywhere on earth where these can be found. There no longer exist the middle roads of "but or maybe...". One needs to act not out of hate but for the realisation of justice and the well-being of all, using force reluctantly, with the heart disarmed, when this appears to be the last means available.

We are well aware that what we are saying is very far from today's materialistic culture. But to become conscious of it is the proof for all of those who identify themselves as men and women of good will. To change our lives we must elevate our vision introducing ethical and spiritual values, understanding that man is not free to think and to act as he believes best. The real freedom consists in following the Universal Laws, which derive from one single principle, eternal and unalterable, called LOVE.
