for the poverty, overconsumption and depletion of natural resources in the world today.

It is said that the hearts of the people are good, throughout the world. It is our minds that can be manipulated and misled. The world crisis today is helping to awaken more and more people and is leading us to take our destinies in our own hands, to question decisions made from above, allegedly in our own interest. All of us are now required to participate actively in the shaping of our planetary future by developing in daily life all the noble qualities

6-8 September 2003 – International Festival “Call of Polesie”, National Park Pripiatski, Belarus

Scientists, educators, artists, journalists, NGO representatives from Belarus, Russia, Poland, the Ukraine and Switzerland, including Rudolf Schneider from the IPS Geneva, participated in this first international ethnic, cultural and ecological festival organised to launch and promote the “Call from Polesie” project for solving ecological and social problems of the region of Polesie, which is rich in cultural traditions and natural landscapes. The project is managed by the association “Ecovita”, in cooperation with local and national authorities and international organisations. The organisation committee of Ecovita is composed of Galina Palskova, Festival Director, Taissa Rogatsch, co-ordinator, and Natalia Potapenko, scientific adviser. 10-15 September 2003 – Yoga Living in Mürren, Switzerland: practice of yoga asanas based on the yoga energy method of Jean Klein, group meditation, lectures on the Maha Mrtyanjaya Mantra, the hymn to He who conquered over death (Shiva). The language of the Scriptures is called sandhya bhasa, or “twilight language”, because the meaning and significance of the words is not literal, it is intended to lead one to “twilight consciousness”, the subjective consciousness of the spiritual world beyond the physical world.

21 September 2003 – Evening meditation and meeting at the Geneva Centre of Brahma Kumaris University.

10-12 October 2003 – Second Seminar “Enlightenment and Education”, Moscow, Russia

This seminar was organised by the Committee on Ecology of State Duma, the Russian AWE Chapter; State Geological Museum on behalf of Vernadsky Museum; and the Association of Foreign Students in Moscow. The goal of the seminar: to stress the importance of popular enlightenment in the educational process, of personal development to form active citizens; to discuss the project “Folk University as a means of popular enlightenment”; to exchange the experiences of local learning centres (LLC) for popular education in different fields of science and social life to form active citizens; and to develop the programme of a Folk University in Moscow. The seminar is considered to be the first step for implementing new programmes of enlightenment and education and for creating a network of LLC in Russia and the CIS.

Three key speeches were made: “The Importance of Enlightenment in the Educational Process” (Jorgen

Hinsby, Denmark), “Three Aspects of Popular Education from Vernadsky’s Point of View” (Georgy Naumov, Moscow) and “The Importance of Enlightenment in Human’s Development” (Kochofa Anicet Gabriel, Benin). Rudolf Schneider (IPS Geneva) also made a contribution to the seminar.

The participants clarified the definitions of “enlightenment” and “education”. Enlightenment is not transformation of knowledge, as in traditional education, but concerns human attitude to a given knowledge, how people develop their will and ability to be active citizens. According to Vernadsky, the process has three phases: upbringing, during which a person develops his or her awareness of being a part of nature; education, by which people are made aware of the fundamental laws of nature; and enlightenment, which is the development of understanding and right attitude to current events.

The project of creating a network of LLC called “Folk University as a Means of Popular Enlightenment” was adopted. The cooperation of Danish partners will be vital to the development of this network in Russia based on the Danish model of Folk Universities.

After this seminar, Rudolf Schneider attended other events organised by the Folk University of the Russian AWE Chapter in Moscow, including a seminar for youth, “Living Values of Youth”, and a meeting with Russian scientists on “Spreading Vernadsky’s Ideas in the West”. 21 and 22 September 2003 - Peace Bell Ringing Ceremony in honour of International Day of Peace and in loving memory of all those that gave their lives for peace. The ceremony was attended on 22 September by the Acting High Commissioner for Human Rights.

7 December 2003 – On the eve of the World Summit on the Information Society, talk on “Conscious Communication” with Dr. Sat-Kaur Khalsa, psychologist. Dr. Khalsa addressed the basic rules of effective communication according to Western communication theory and Eastern communication

concepts. The Western concepts highlight the importance of awareness of self, awareness of others and awareness of non-verbal as well as verbal communication. Eastern concepts add to the above the awareness of Higher Self and the frequency of communication, that is the different qualities of communication according to the chakras: defensive/aggressive (base chakra), sexually oriented (sacral chakra), controlling (solar plexus), kind (heart chakra), truthful but blunt (throat chakra), truthful but diplomatic (ajna chakra), conveying universal and divine truth (crown chakra). Dr. Khalsa also showed how to practice alternate nostril breathing as a means to balance our energy level and emotions. A lively discussion followed.
